report when it happens inside the premises of Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc. Everyone returned home with a surplus of information to be kept in mind.



Furthermore, all participants of Payatas and Ms. Germaine received certificates. Everyone went home with happiness and wisdom in their heart.

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

February 15 & 17, 2023





The formation was officiated by our Parola Inter-Agency Network (PIAN)- International Container Terminal Services Inc. (ICTSI) co- partnership from FPOP Mr. Michael B. Himor Chapter Program Manager Family Planning Organization of the Philippines (FPOP) and Bien Mark Louise A. Amonelo the Youth Volunteer. The formation was facilitated by Payatas and Parola staff's and it was attended by the learners.

Mr. Himor taught our learners to be responsible on Teenage Sexuality, Relationships and Values Clarification on CSE. CSE term to enlighten and give idea for young people to take responsibility for their own decisions and

behaviors in terms of sexuality and relationship due to upwards ratio of teenage pregnancy and illness due to unproductive sex this formation give them a heads up to protect themselves and taking charge of their lives in this kind of circumstances. Mr. Amonelo emphasized the Sexual Orientation Gender Identity or Expression (SOGIE), also known as Anti-Discrimination Bill aims to protect people who are continually harmed from a societal and institutional level. It is about ensuring that people are protected from abuse, dehumanization, and violence. Seeking an end to abuse is not about special treatment. It is about wanting to be respected as human beings.



On February 18, 2023, the School Division of Quezon City through the regional memorandum No. 024 s. 2023 had conducted a Mass Training of ALS Teachers and their Partners on the Implementation of the ALS Act and It's Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) at Varela Conference Hall, DEPED NCR. This mass training intends to update ALS teachers and their partners on the different provisions of the Republic Act No. 11510 also known as the Alternative Learning System Act, which is a parallel learning system that provides opportunities for Out-of-School Youth and Adult (OSYA) learners to develop basic and functional literacy skills, and to access equivalent pathways to complete basic and to educate all ALS implementers on the use of facilitation and learning methods, tools, and strategies for RA 11510 and IRR advocacy.



PAYATAS ASH WEDNESDAY


February 22, 2023

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

February 22, 2023





The mass ended in singing "Panagutan"

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

FUN RUN 2023

Theme: "BIDA Bayanihan ng Mamamayan Fight against Drugs"

February 26, 2023

Drug is any substance (other than food) that is used to prevent, diagnose, treat, or relieve symptoms of a disease or abnormal condition. Drugs can also affect how the brain and the rest of the body work and cause changes in mood, awareness, thoughts, feelings, or behavior.

On February 26, 2023, around 16,000 runners participated in a Fun Run at the Mall of Asia grounds in Pasay City Sunday, to show their support for the Government's Campaign against illegal drugs. The Parola PSPEI Staff's Mr. Darren M. Ilarina, Ms. Elijah Echevarria, Ms. Lucita Lachica - Livelihood Coordinator and Ms. Angel Miralles-RSW and 19 Junior High School learners took part in the Fun Run events.

The "Buhay Ingatan, Droga Ayawan (BIDA) Bayanihan ng Mamamayan Fun Run at Serbisyo Caravan" is considered one of the largest turnouts for any event organized by the Department of the Interior and Local Government

(DILG). It seeks to promote DILG's renewed anti-drug campaign that started last November.

According to Benhur Abalos Jr., "Together, we will conquer drugs and show that the Philippines are against it. We know this is a global problem. This day proves that the Philippine National Police (PNP) and Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) are not the only ones fighting drugs."

This event is very significant to our learners because it shows that encouraging young people to engage in productive activities like sports might help them avoiding the risks of using illegal drugs.
