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



## EDM Project Leader Meeting



## **1st Death Anniversary of Fr. Artur: Honoring His Legacy of Love and Service**





## **United Nation Convention on the Rights of the Child**

August 4 and 27, 2025

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) is a landmark international treaty that outlines the fundamental rights of children, including their right to protection, development, participation, and survival. It serves as a guiding framework to ensure that every child, regardless of background, is treated with dignity and given opportunities to thrive. In line with this vision, Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc. (PSPESI) continues its commitment to raising awareness and empowering communities to uphold and protect these rights.

On Monday, August 4, 2025, PSPESI hosted a UNCRC seminar at the Parola Center, led by Sr. Ruth Baguinon, SDS, Executive Director of the Salvatorian Pastoral Care for Children (SPCC). A staunch advocate for children's welfare, Sr. Ruth emphasized the significance of the UNCRC in safeguarding the well-being of every child.

Her discussion encouraged participants to actively engage in promoting children's rights within their communities, highlighting the shared responsibility of individuals and organizations to ensure that no child is left behind.

Meanwhile, on Wednesday, August 27, 2025, another UNCRC seminar was conducted at the Payatas Center, facilitated by Sr. Mary Adeline Abamo, SDS. The session focused on children's fundamental rights and featured an interactive group activity where learners shared real-life examples of happy and challenging experiences at home. Sr. Mary Adeline underscored the importance of open communication as a pathway to healing and mutual support, allowing participants to reflect deeply on their own situations. 





## **HIV/AIDS Awareness and Hygiene Formation Seminar**



## **Livelihood Program: Skills Training on Housekeeping Update**

August 14 and 24, 2025

Thirteen Parola Livelihood beneficiaries successfully completed a 20-day Housekeeping Skills Training at the Manila Manpower Development Center in Tayuman. This program was funded by the lead agency ICTSI-International Container Terminal Services, Inc. and included free transportation, training materials, and assessment fees.

The training required participants to undergo a comprehensive program followed by the

Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) assessment. All thirteen beneficiaries successfully passed and are now National Certificate II holders in Housekeeping, opening opportunities for them to seek employment in the field.

The participants celebrated their graduation on August 14, 2025, and formally received their National Certificate II (NC II) on August 23, 2025.








This partnership marks a significant step in advancing education and child development initiatives, reflecting the shared commitment of both institutions to serve the community.

## **SAN BEDA University Community Engagement activities with ALSA BUHAY Learners**

August 20, 2025

Following the formal signing, San Beda University immediately began its engagement with the learners of PSPEI. On August 20, 2025, two groups of Grade 11 Humanities and Social Sciences (HUMSS) students facilitated a media literacy training for 30 Alternative Learning System (ALS) Junior High School learners at the Parola Center.

The session equipped participants with practical skills to identify fake news, AI-generated videos, and altered images, and to effectively search for reliable information. It also highlighted the importance of using artificial intelligence responsibly and positively in everyday life.

The activity concluded with a simple fellowship, as San Beda students shared snacks with the ALS learners, fostering a sense of camaraderie and community spirit. This initiative marks the beginning of collaborative efforts between PSPEI and San Beda University toward promoting education, critical thinking, and responsible digital citizenship among out-of-school youth.



## **17th National Congress of Parish-Based Child Rights Advocates**

August 21 - 23, 2025 - ILOILO CITY

The 17th National Congress of Parish-Based Child Rights Advocates convened 91 delegates from three archdioceses, seven dioceses, mission partners, and stakeholders at Punta Villa Resort, Iloilo City, with the theme: “Whoever receives this child receives me” (Mt. 18:5).

The congress celebrated its 24 years of child-centered initiatives—advocacy campaigns, emergency services, values formation, and partnerships—while also addressing pressing issues affecting Filipino children today. Delegates expressed deep concern over online sexual exploitation, child labor, violence in homes and institutions, and the increasing cases of depression and anxiety among the youth. They also firmly opposed proposals to lower the minimum age of criminal liability, stressing the importance of rehabilitation and community-based interventions over punitive measures.

Discussions further highlighted the climate and disaster risks confronting children, the weak implementation of protective laws, and the urgent call to widen access to education, healthcare, and mental health services.

In their collective statement, participants pledged to:


- Protect children in vulnerable situations,
- Strengthen parish-based child rights advocates and safeguarding ministries,
- Ensure children's participation in programs and decision-making, and
- Hold government accountable for responsive child-focused policies and services.

Organized by the Salvatorian Pastoral Care for Children, together with the Share Global Salvatorian Sisters Solidarity Office and Dreikönigsaktion Hilfswerk der Katholischen Jungschar (Three Kings Action aid organization of the Catholic Youth), the congress ended with a united commitment: to build safe spaces where children are protected, empowered, and nurtured within a just and humane society.

## **Roll out training on family development session Module: Sustain youth and children interest in school (SYCIS)**

August 21 - 23, 2025 - ILOILO CITY

On August 27–28, 2025, at the Federal Filipino Chinese Chamber Inc., Binondo, Manila, Puso sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc. (PSPEI) staff and partner organizations participated in a two-day roll-out training aimed at advancing the cause of education and strengthening advocacy for children and youth.

Day One focused on collaborative learning and sharing of best practices. Key topics discussed included the situation of children and youth within the NCR context, addressing family and parental conflicts, and tackling issues related to bullying. The day concluded with an open forum that provided participants the opportunity to reflect, exchange insights, and deepen their understanding of these pressing concerns.



Day Two highlighted the urgent topic of abuse against children and youth. The session examined its various types and forms, its effects, and the available programs and services designed to help create safer environments for young people. The final discussion centered on stress management as a crucial component of mental health, emphasizing the importance of understanding stress, identifying its sources, recognizing its effects, and applying coping strategies and practical techniques for daily life.

The training concluded with a stronger collective understanding of the factors contributing to the abuse of children and youth, along with a renewed commitment to developing more effective prevention and intervention strategies.






September 2 - 4, 2025





## CHILD PROTECTION POLICY: Rules for Good Boundaries

September 18 and 19, 2025

Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon Inc. (PSPEI) conducted a formation session titled “Rules for Good Boundaries” under the Child Protection Policy, led by Rev. Fr. Christopher B. Osares, SDS. The session was held on September 18, 2025, at the Parola Center, and on September 19, 2025, at the Payatas Center. The formation focused on nine essential principles that guide healthy and respectful relationships: length of time, knowledge about the other person, sharing of experiences, amount of self-disclosure, number of different encounters, role appropriateness, age appropriateness, level of reciprocal trust, and level of commitment.

Fr. Osares emphasized that these rules are vital for children's growth and empowerment. They help learners build self-awareness, develop a sense of security, and understand how to set personal boundaries in their interactions with others and within themselves.

To conclude the session, Fr. Cris invited participants to reflect on what they had learned and to share which rule they felt was most relevant to their personal experience. The sharing allowed the learners to deepen their understanding and apply the lessons to real-life situations.


