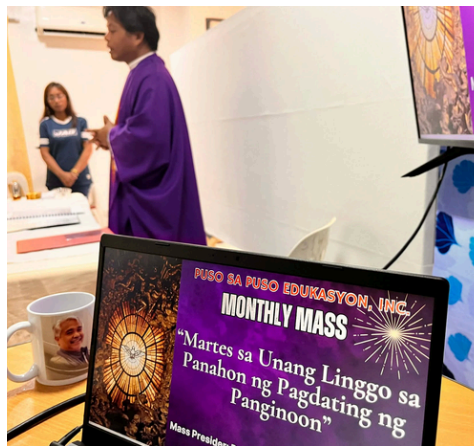
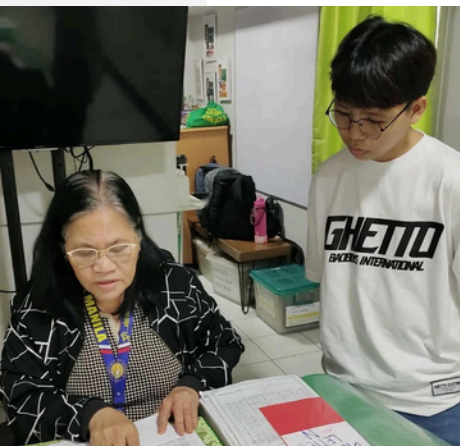

Medical Mission Brings Health and Hope to Delpan Complex

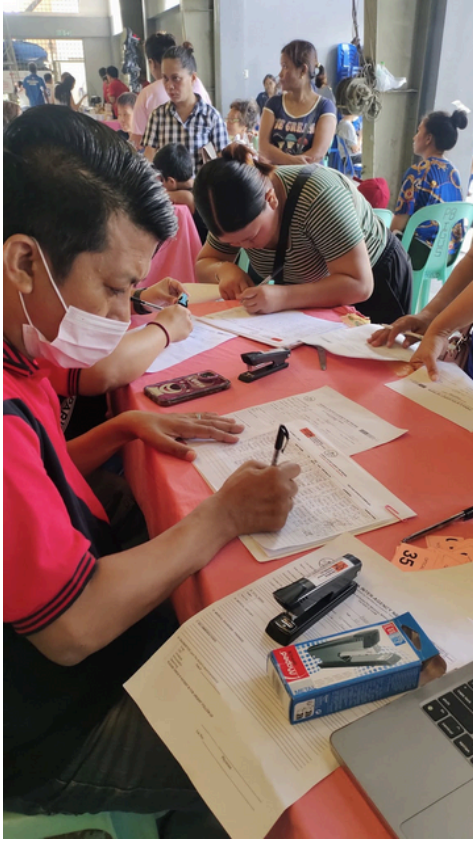
October 2, 2025 | Delpan Complex, Manila

A successful Medical Mission was held at Delpan Complex on October 2, 2025 (Thursday), bringing accessible healthcare and genuine compassion to the community. The activity was organized by the International Container Terminal Services, Inc. (ICTSI) through the Parola Inter-Agency Network (PIAN) Health Cluster, with strong support from Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon Inc. (PSPEI), the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), the Educational Research and Development Assistance Foundation Inc. (ERDA), the Manila Department of Social Welfare (MDSW), the Center for Community Transformation (CCT), and Plan International Pilipinas.

A total of 688 beneficiaries received free medical and wellness services, thanks to Manila Doctors Hospital and to the volunteer nursing and dental students from Centro Escolar University (CEU), who generously shared their time and expertise. The services offered during the mission included medical consultations, optical and dental check-ups, vaccinations, therapeutic massages, and reproductive health services—all aimed at promoting the well-being of the community.

Beyond the medical assistance, the mission highlighted the power of partnership and the spirit of bayanihan. It showcased how united efforts between organizations and volunteers can bring not only medical care but also hope and dignity to those most in need. Through this joint initiative, the organizers reaffirmed their shared commitment to promoting health, compassion, and community empowerment—proving that together, we can build a healthier and more caring nation.

Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc. was delighted to be part of Alternative Learning System (ALS) Micro-Certification assessment in Manila. This assessment aims to recognize the life skills of ALS learners through micro-certification, a system of providing recognition for competencies such as communication, leadership, teamwork, and problem-solving. By providing certification for these competencies, Department of Education aims to strengthen the pathways towards further work immersion, and lifelong learning. This with the help of partner institutions such as; United Nation International Children's Emergency Funds (UNICEF), Department of Labor and Employment, Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and Bureau of Alternative Education (BAE) it continues to weave connections between alternative education, employment, and community participation.

On, October 13, 2025, a Micro-Certification culminating activity has happened and held at the Almario Rosaura Elementary School. There were ten chosen PSPEI learners who joined to the Micro-certification assessment and received a certificate that they can use for work. This was attended by the DepEd officials, BAEs, and representative from UNICEF Philippines. It ended with a video presentation acknowledging the efforts of teachers and learners. Modification of Road Safety Modules for Children

Road safety education plays a vital role in protecting children, who are among the most vulnerable road users. To make learning more engaging and age-appropriate, the Workshop on Enhancing the Road Safety for Children Module was held on October 17, 2025, at the Ramada Hotel, Ongpin, Binondo, Manila, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The event was organized by International Container Terminal Services, Inc. (ICTSI) with the Parola Inter-Agency Network (PIAN), brought together educators, community partners, and child welfare advocates who share a common goal ensuring safer environments for children on and around roads.

The modified module introduces children to essential road safety concepts such as the meaning of traffic lights, the proper use of pedestrian lanes, and the importance of wearing helmets and seatbelts—through interactive and enjoyable learning activities like games, storytelling, and simulations. These activities aim to instill awareness, discipline, and responsibility among children as future road users.

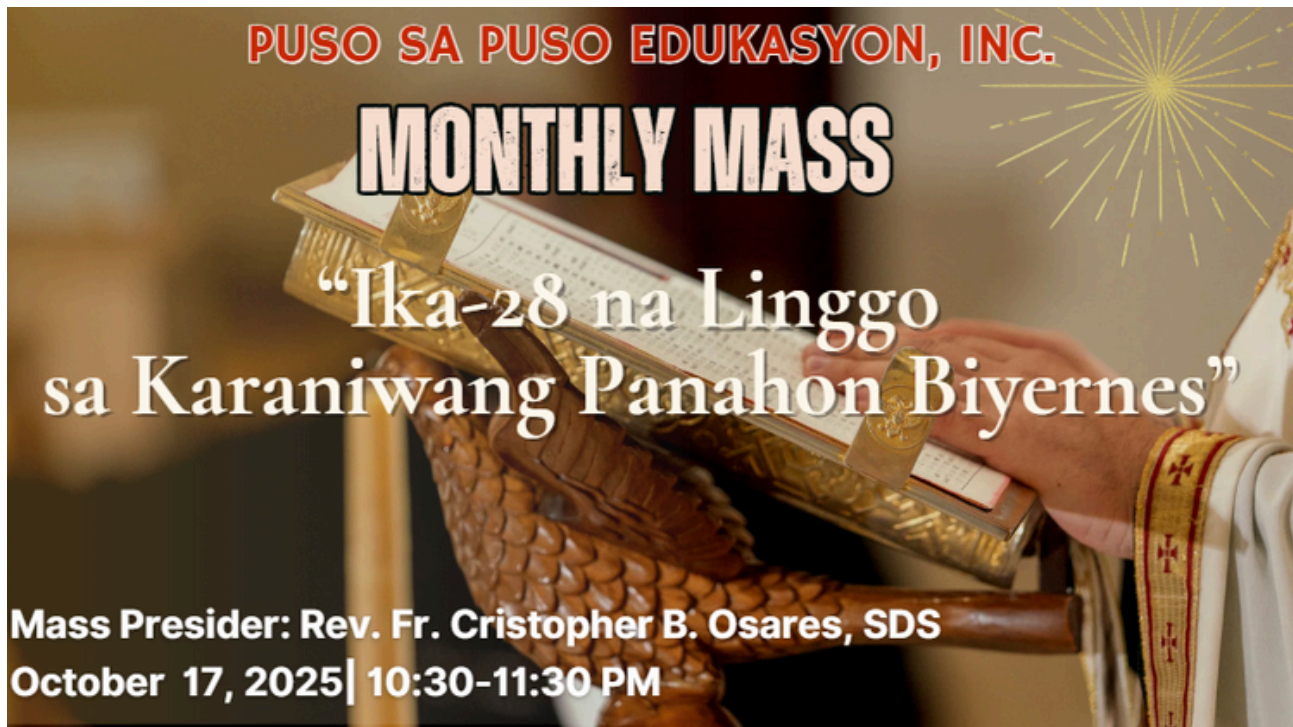

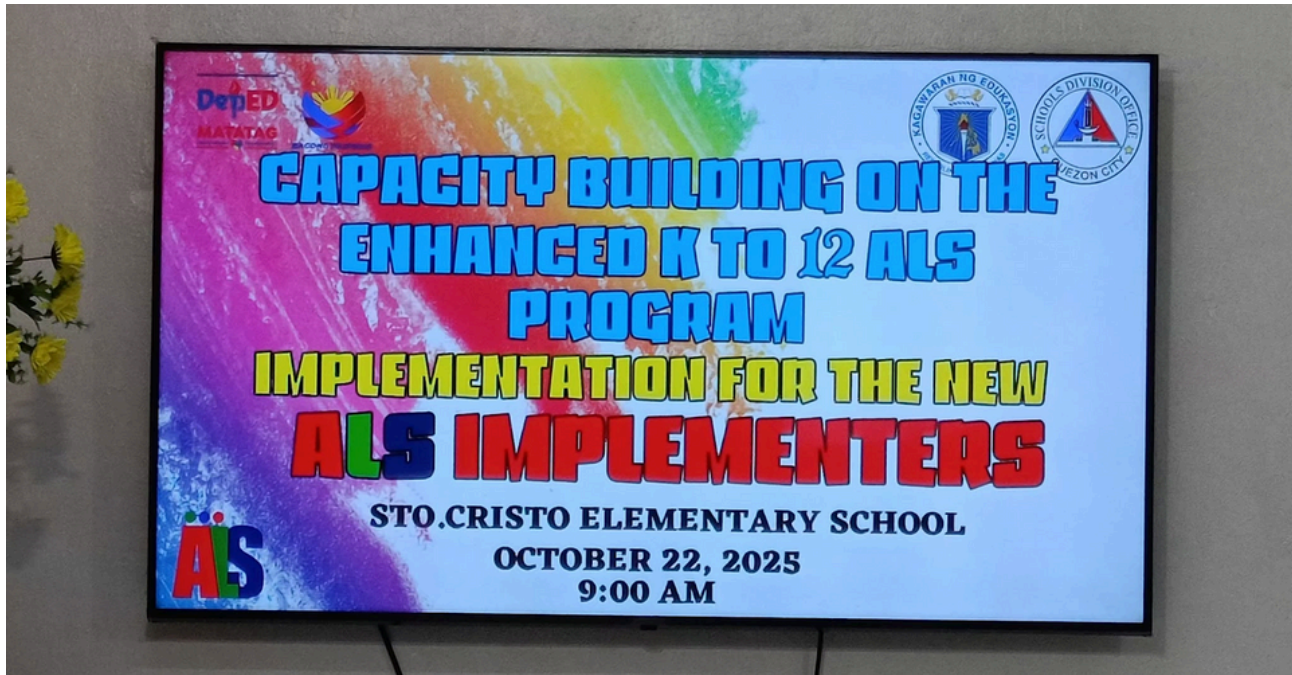

Capacity Building on the Enhanced K to 12 ALS Program Implementation for the New ALS Implementers.

October 22, 23 and 24, 2025 | Sto. Cristo Elementary School, Quezon City

The Department of Education (DepEd) conducted a three-day training workshop from October 22 to 24, 2025, at Sto. Cristo Elementary School, for the new Alternative Learning System (ALS) implementers. The activity aimed to strengthen the competencies of educators and facilitators in delivering quality alternative education to out-of-school youth and adult learners.

Representing Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc. (PSPEI) were Mr. John Mark Acuin and Ms. Vicky-Jean G. Ogalinola, who actively participated throughout the sessions.

On the first day, discussions focused on updates regarding the DepEd Recognition of ALS Providers and the Guidelines for the New ALS Program, particularly Republic Act 11510 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). These sessions deepened the participants' understanding of the policies and standards guiding ALS implementation nationwide.

The second day highlighted Work-Based Learning, emphasizing how experiential education bridges the gap between classroom knowledge and workplace application. Participants also learned about the proper use of ALS forms and program management processes.

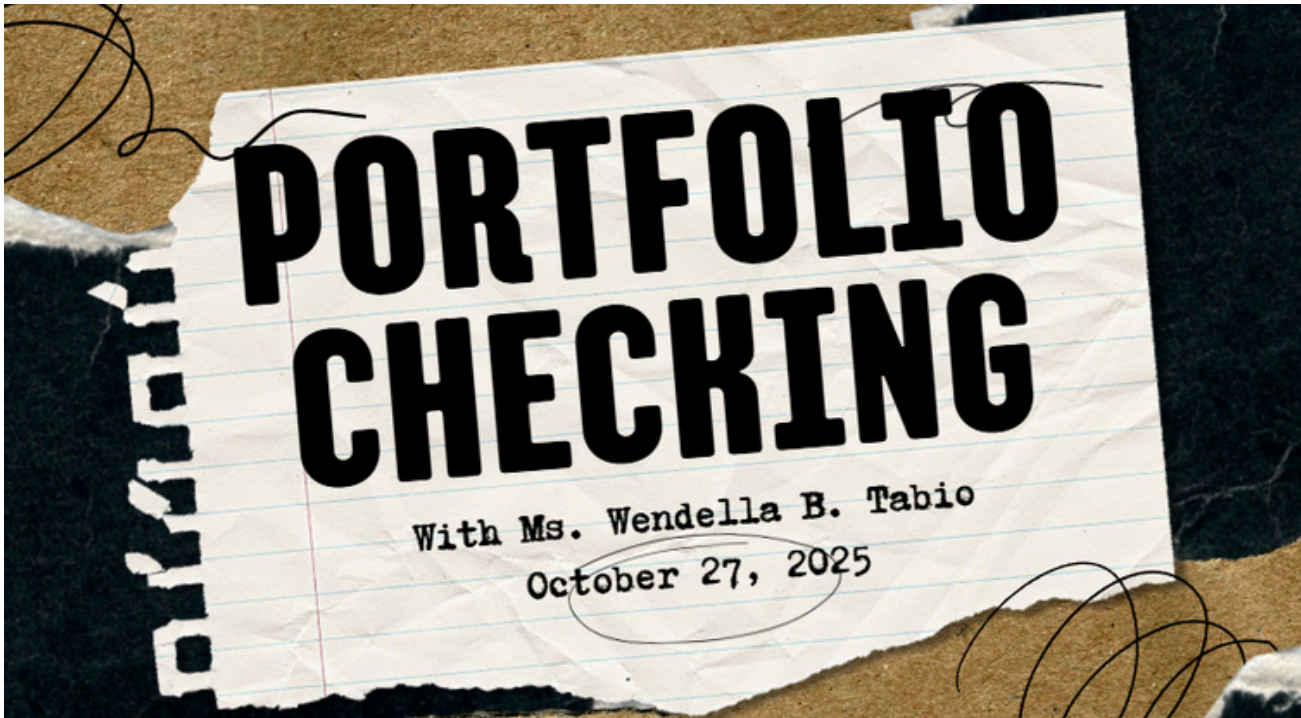
The third and final day centered on the Learner's Information System (LIS)—an online platform that manages learner registration and academic records—and the “Be Your Own Boss” module, which promotes entrepreneurship through practical training on business development and environmental scanning.

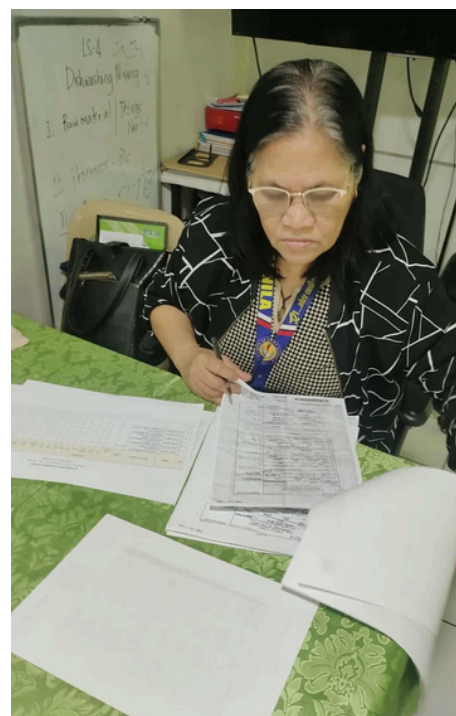
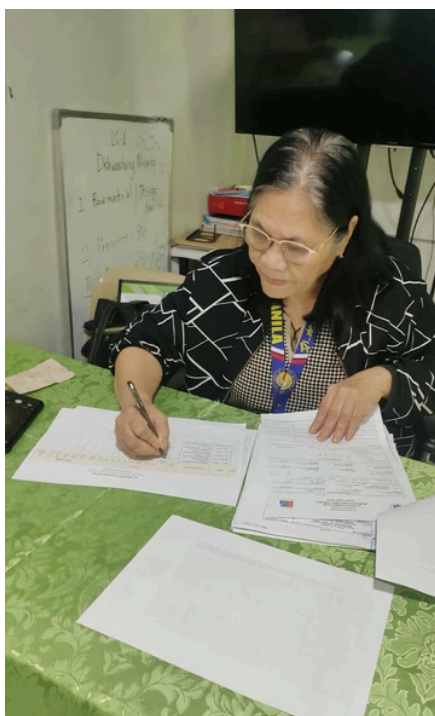
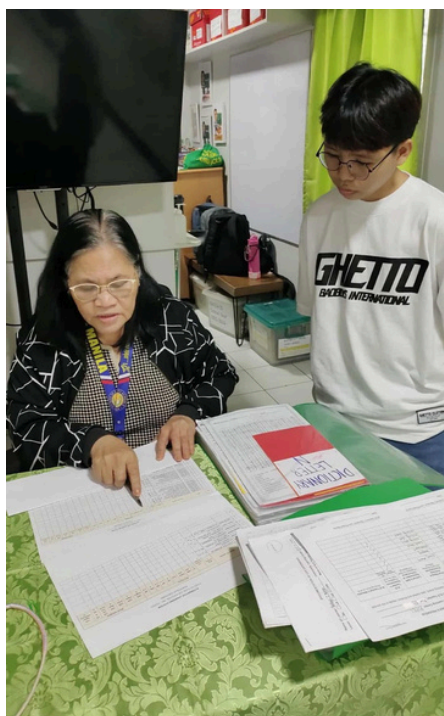

Following the Mass, the celebration continued with a short program that recognized the dedication of staff members, volunteers, and community partners who have journeyed

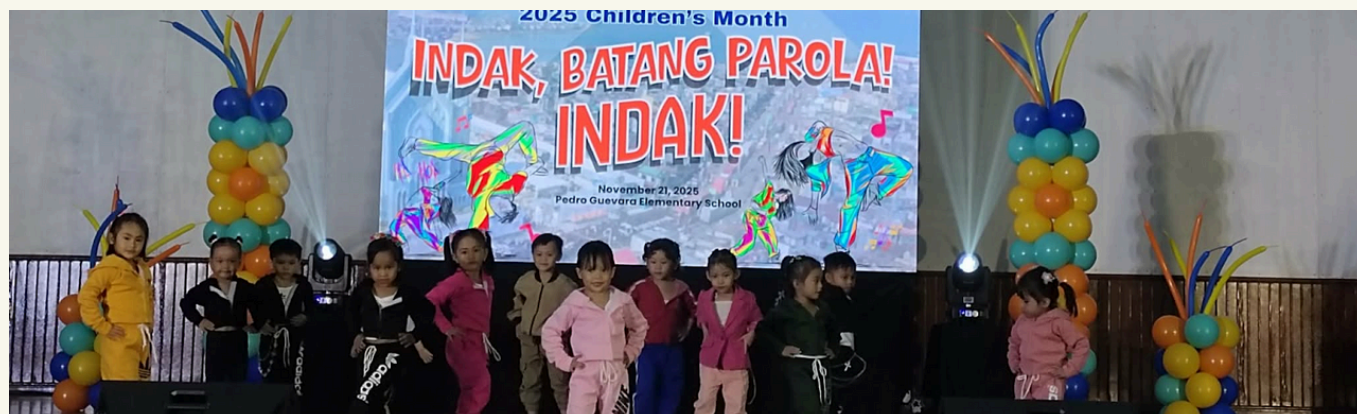

PIAN Year-End Evaluation, Assessment, Strategic Planning & Year-End Party 2025

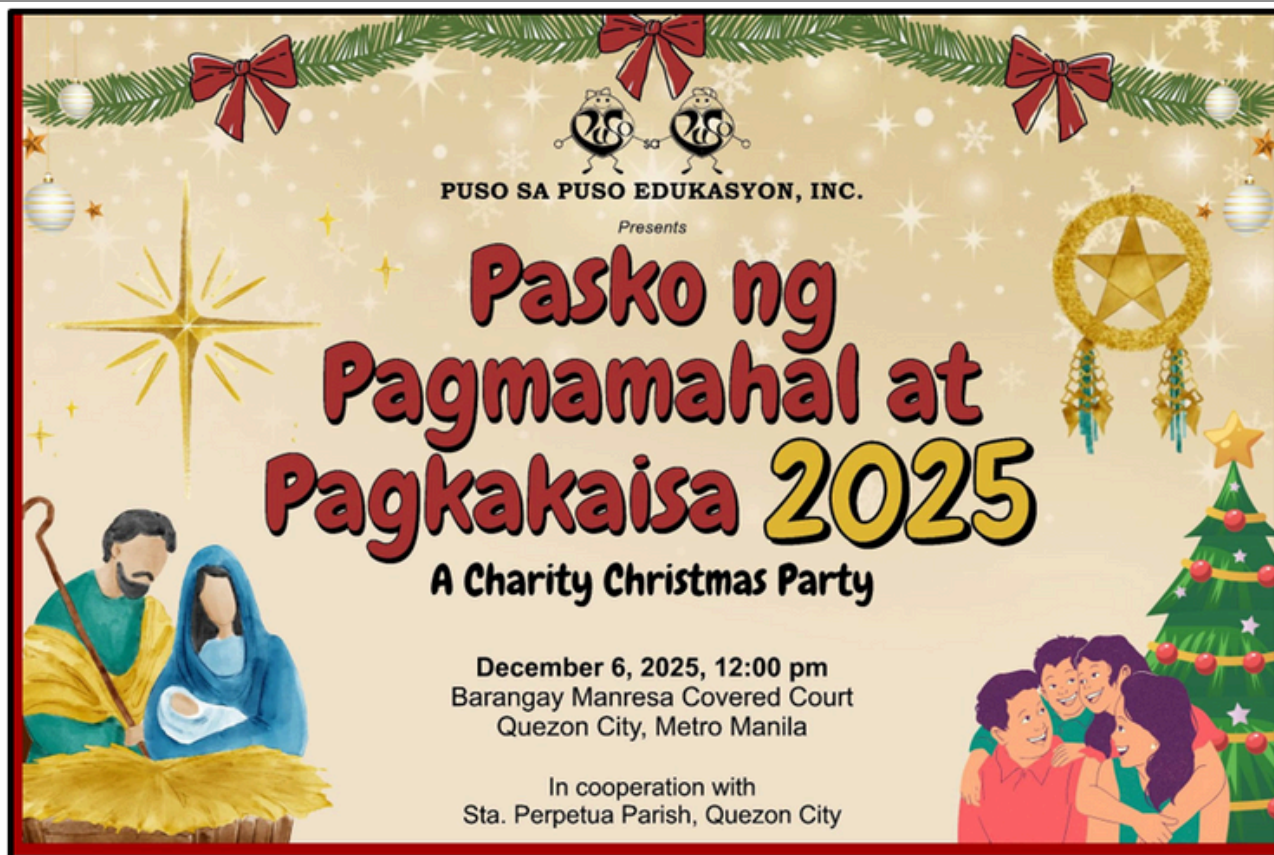
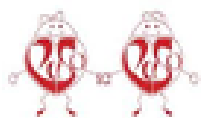
December 4-5, 2025 | Hotel Lucky China Town, Binondo, Manila City

December 6, 2025 | Brgy. Manresa Covered Court, Quezon City

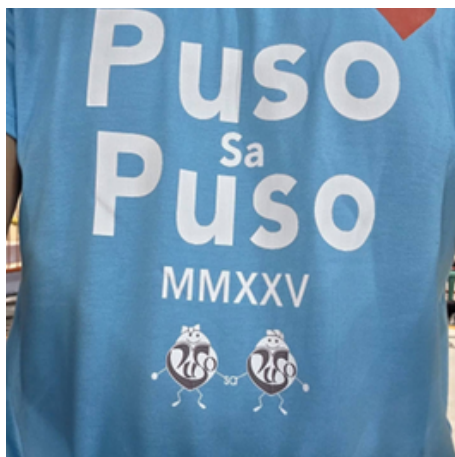

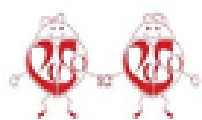

Christmas Gathering of EDM Scholars

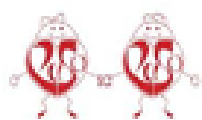

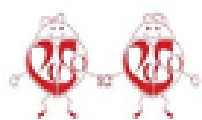

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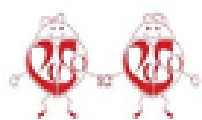
