

(July 13, 2018)




Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) is an anti-drug program taught to Elementary and Junior High School students. Lessons are taught by a uniformed police officer that shows students the hazards of drug abuse and violence and teaches them practical ways of resist those pressures.

Through collaboration and partnership between Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc., the Station Community Awareness and Development (SCAD) Moriones, Tondo Police Station and Social work interns from Universidad De Manila, a seminar on Drug Abuse Resistance Education was conducted, attended by Sixty (60) Secondary learners from ALSA-BUHAY Program.

The activity was led by PO1 Noel Haclawon, of Station Community Awareness and Development (SCAD) together with PO1 Isaac Fernandez, PO2 Larycel Gonzales with the supervision of Police Superintendent Dave Antonio Mejia, Station Commander. The activity was held at the SCAD office.

The resource speaker focused on orienting the participants on the country's drug abuse problem, the ill effects of drug abuse and the legal consequences of being involved in illegal drugs activities.

At the end of the activity, certificate of appreciation was awarded by Mr. Eljohn Isagunde, LPT to PO1 Noel Haclawon.



It was a whole day activity. The last part was the culminating exercise were in the participant received certificate of attendance and filled up evaluation form for the said activity.



Before she ends her talks, she let the participants answer the following question. "What is the best talent that I can share with others?" everyone answers in the small group then share their answer to everybody.


The formation was able to motivate learners to become more responsible and steward of what blessings they have received. They realize the importance of sharing even in a simple way.





Last August 10, 2018, a formation on United Nation on the Rights of the Children was conducted to the learners of ALSA BUHAY under Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc., facilitated by Sr. Belen Santiago, SDS and Ms. Joan Canero, RSW of Salvatorian Pastoral Care for the Children, SPCC, NCR. The formation seminar was divided into two session (Morning and afternoon). A total of 70 learners participated in the said activity.

The same formation seminar was also conducted to the parents of Alsa Buhay and Mother and Child Health and Nutrition Program (MCHNP) last August 15, 2018 held at Multi-purpose hall of Barangay 275, Zone 25, Binondo Manila. Spearheaded by Ms. Jana Palomique, RSW, and Ms. Angie Vicente of SPCC (Salvatorian Pastoral Care for Children).

The session begins with an opening prayer headed by one of the parents of Mother and Child Health and Nutrition Program in Gate 1, Parola compound, Tondo Manila. The first activity was about "Getting to know your participant", facilitated by Ms. Angie Vicente, and followed by Group sharing on the "Good and Bad news in the community." Ms. Jana discussed the basic and fundamental rights and responsibilities of being parent. Ms. Jana's strategy is so much related to human experiences, in other words, basic parenting issues and how parenting gave its gap to raising their children at home.


At the end, the parents/learners were enlightened on their rights and responsibilities. It brings them awareness about the significance of their welfare in connection with the topics that have discussed.

Mass Training for Implementation on the Enhanced Curriculum and Learning Materials
(August 17-18, 2018)



Education plays a very important and vital role in the development and progress of each individual. It enables them to improve their quality of life and become an effective contributor of the society. With this new K to 12 curriculum, the Department of Education ensures that the Alternative Learning System (ALS) is aligned with the new curriculum. Comparable to the formal school, ALS curriculum reflect the set of knowledge, skills and competencies that learners should develop to meet the minimum requirement of basic education.

In line with this, last August 17 to 18, 2018 the Department of Education conducted a two-day seminar regarding the implementation on the enhanced curriculum and learning materials at the Don Alejandro Roses Sr. Science and Technology High School. Around 300 instructional managers from different district in Quezon City attended the said event. This effort aimed to prepare different ALS provider for the implementation of the new curriculum and for the significant expansion of the context scope to ensure the alignment with the K to 12 school curriculums. This includes the increase number of competencies from 776 existing learning competencies to 2,046. They also added one learning strand known as "digital literacy". This strands address the need to develop basic skill in ICT and equip ALS learner with the critical knowledge, skills, and values to be able to live and work effectively as part of digital universe.



Payatas Formation on UNCRC

(August 24, 2018)



An informative formation was held at Payatas center, last August 24, 2018 that benefited and fed the minds of our dear learners. It was attended by BLP learners, Elementary, and Secondary learners. Ms. Joceline Basconcillo, RSW and Ms. Jeniffer Basconcillo, RSW were the ones who facilitated the formation, with the help of social work interns from Unibersidad de Manila namely: Mae Flora Baloro, Daniel Salonga, and Aila Dennise Reyes. The Basconcillo sisters are the social workers of Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc. from Payatas and Parola center.

United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) a human rights treaty which sets out the civil, political, economic, social, health, and cultural rights of children. It acknowledges the primary role of parents and the family in the care and protection of children, as well as the obligation of the State to help. The speakers discussed the basic facts about the rights of each child which included the 4 range of child rights:

1. Survival rights – right to live and give the needs that are most basic to their existence.
2. Development rights – right to send the child to school as to experience to mingle with other children and to explore the world.
3. Protection rights – ensure the children are safeguarded against all forms of abuse, neglect, and exploitation.
4. Participation rights – encompass children's freedom to express opinions.

The speakers elaborated and gave examples on each rights for the better understanding of the learners. The learners were divided into 3 groups for them to brainstorm with their co-learners and to share their experiences during their childhood days.

Each learner participated in the said formation and left the center with a knowledge about their rights and willing to share it to their families and friends.













Career Orientation
(September 13 & 19, 2018)



Last September 13 and 19, Parola center held their annual career orientation for the 7th batch of secondary learners. This was collaborated with the Parola Inter-Agency Network Education Cluster. It was held at ICTSI Foundation Multi-Purpose Hall, ECJ Building Intramuros Manila. The two days event aims to give the participants the realistic view of what is next when they graduated ALS, and the two possible paths that they may take; employment and the higher education. Other from the main speaker who facilitated the main orientation, Parola center and PIAN-Education cluster also invited other educational institutions like Universidad De Manila (UDM) and Don Bosco TVET Center to give them heads up about their programs and the possible tracks that they may take if they decided to continue their study either formal or Technical education

The event was facilitated by Mr. Erick Atilano, LPT, MA, RPs. an expert inclined with Human Resource industry and analysis of Job trends in the country. At first day, the speaker summarized his discussion in three topics such as; Self-awareness which leads the participants to discover their aptitudes, interest, values and personality traits. The other one is Educational Awareness which makes the participants understand the relationship between their self, education opportunities and the world of work as important factors in a career planning. The last one was the Career Awareness which talks about the world of work and the Labor market Information.

In the morning of the second day Mr. Erick Atilano discussed the basic skills on preparing resume and interview. It was the preparation for the afternoon activity where the participants had a first-hand experience in applying job and mock interview. Those experiences brought lot of learnings to the participants about the real situation in the world of work.

All the activities, simulations and learnings of the participants in two days event were synthesized by the speaker and encourage them to take courage to step forward and not to be contented on what they have achieved.



(September 20, 2018)


