





Lorna Laberinto, a mother, enrolled in ALSA BUHAY belong on 6<sup>th</sup> batch in Parola center. In her first attempt to take the A&E test, she failed, but she never loses hope and took the exam again. In her second attempt, luckily she passed the test and decided to enroll in Vocational courses and take up housekeeping. She passed the NC2 (National Certificate 2), and now, she is currently working at Red Planet Hotel and got promoted as a team leader.

Christian Terana from 3<sup>rd</sup> batch in ALSA BUHAY Payatas center, graduating in college in a two-year course with an excellence award, a scholar of Enfant Du Mekong, shared his experiences as a dreamer that turned into reality. He never stopped chasing his dreams until it became into reality, the fruit of his labor as a student was slowly evident in his hands. He also thanked the organization for an unceasingly support and molding him as a better person. He took Hotel and Restaurant Services at Bestlink College of the Philippines.

After the sharing, participants were asked to write their own dream ten years from now. It will serve as their reminder to move forward and take all challenges they might encounter.


chasing their dreams despite of the difficulties, rejections, and failures they had in the past. Stand and continue to dream.

April 9 – 12, 2019





This seminar was at the right time since this month is a Fire Prevention Month and the area of Parola is prone to fire accident. In addition, recently, everyone experienced the shaken of the land which it started in Luzon, the next day in Visayas, and the next day in Mindanao. This is a good opportunity to all attendees to be knowledgeable enough in case there is a fire incident or an earthquake. It was a preparation in any calamities might occur everywhere.









## **Mindanao Youth for Development Module Training**

May 27-30, 2019



The Department of Education has released an updated curriculum for the Alternative Learning System to align with the K-12 basic education curriculum. This new curriculum will help the learners to develop their skills more and will avail the quality of education; higher education, employment, entrepreneurship, and middle-level skills development.

The four-day training held at Padre Mariano Gomez Elementary School, Manila last May 27-30, 2019, was attended by the different ALS implementers in public and private schools, and even Non-Government Organizations. It was spearheaded by the Division of City Schools Manila. Puso Sa Puso Edukasyon, Inc. staff are indeed thankful to be part in the said training.

Ms. Ma. Cristeta C. Blanco, ALS Education Program Supervisor from DepEd Manila, warmly welcomed all the participants and guests as they arrived and participated in the training. The main objective of the training is to enhance the competence of all implementers of the Basic Education and K-12 curricula. They also introduced the new MY Dev (Mindanao Youth for Development) module that will be taught for two months. Its main purpose is to become the learners work ready and civically engaged after studying in ALS.

The My Dev module composed of 9 modules namely: (1) Personal Development, (2) Interpersonal Communication, (3) Leadership-Teamwork, (4) Work Habits, (5) Safety and Health at Work, (6) Rights and Responsibilities, (7) Financial Fitness, (8) Exploring Entrepreneurship, (9) Civic Engagement. These modules were demonstrated by the public school teachers in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> day of the training and they were evaluated by the Master Teachers and their Supervisors.

The last day of the training were allotted to plan and budget the time when to start and finish the 9 modules. All participants enjoyed and learned a lot! It will strengthen the partnership among the NGOs and the Division of City Schools, Manila. It will help the learners to prepare for their future career. The last part of the training was the distribution of certificates to the participants as they finished the 4-day training.



June 2-4, 2019



These previous ALS learners and now a college graduates, are proofs that dreams do come true!






